

ISIS resumed its effective spectacular attacks in Baghdad, which had dropped since the fall of Mosul. The mobilization of Iraqi Shi'a militias and deployment of CTS in Baghdad have not neutralized ISIS' attack capabilities in the capital. The attacks in Mahmudiya, which has been quiet for several months, have opened a new front on the southern belt of Baghdad. The ISF will likely shift attention and resources to the south of Baghdad to meet this challenge. The situation in Tikrit remains fluid and may constitute a "meeting engagement" for ISIS and the ISF if both sides attempt to reinforce their positions. ISIS' Euphrates offensive continues. ISIS is setting conditions for an attack on the dam near Haditha, and the ISF reinforced the position on 21 June. ISIS is likely drawing the ISF into an engagement and stretching its forces thin, in Haditha and elsewhere, in order to create the necessary gaps among government forces that will allow ISIS to carry out a spectacular attack on another front.
