The Iraqi government is preparing defenses for the Battle of Baghdad as Ramadan approaches. This effort is centered on securing areas near the Green Zone and the Baghdad Belts. The government's plan will also likely include the deployment of Iraqi Shi'a militias. ISIS's gains in Ramadi indicate the increasing threat to the city as it remains one of the few remaining areas in Anbar under Iraqi government control. ISW has assessed that ISIS aims to take Ramadi as part of its interim, operational objectives. Ramadi's fall would facilitate ISIS's push into Baghdad.
