The clashes between the Iraqi Security Forces and the followers of Iraqi Shi'a religious figure Mahmoud al-Sarkhi represent another challenge for the ISF. ISIS's campaign to target civilians in areas where it has control is likely to backfire, particularly if the group attempts to force people to pledge allegiance to its newly-declared Islamic State. ISIS systematically documented a mass "repentance" in Mosul. Similar, systematic "repentance ceremonies" of former ISF members elsewhere will help indicate the extent of ISIS's influence. Groups such as JRTN and local tribes may see this behavior as an opportunity to weaken ISIS. Nonetheless, ISIS remains the strongest insurgent group and continues to be able to impose its will on the population through the use of force.
