
## Iraq Situation Report: August 6, 2014



ISIS control of Sinjar has severely escalated the humanitarian crisis in northern Iraq, especially for minority populations like the Yezidis that face brutal persecution if they attempt to subsist under ISIS control. ISIS attacked into areas northeast and southeast of Mosul on August 6, likely in response to the Peshmerga offensive in the vicinity of Mosul launched on August 5. Early reports that ISIS has seized Goyar and Makhmur, areas southeast of Mosul, suggest that ISIS may be able to withstand the Peshmerga's offensive and seize control of new ground while in contact. Furthermore, these areas fall along the natural boundary between Ninewa and Arbil, and both are interior to Arbil province. The Peshmerga will likely need to concentrate Arbil's defense in response, which may compromise its ability to attack ISIS elsewhere. On other fronts, ISIS seized Barwana, a town immediately proximate to Haditha city and the Haditha dam. ISIS likely seeks to control them both and drive the ISF defensive line in Anbar east to Ramadi, securing control of the Middle Euphrates. This zone represents a strategic defense by the ISF and anti-ISIS Sunni tribes. The continuation of clustered VBIED activity in Baghdad demonstrates the persistent threat to the capital.
